How to Contact the Disciplinary or Licensing Authority

Your Right to File a Complaint

Clients have the right to file a complaint if they believe their privacy rights have been violated or if they have concerns about the professional conduct of the therapist. Filing a complaint will not result in retaliation or affect your ability to receive services.

Complaints may be filed with:

- The therapist directly
- The appropriate Texas licensing or disciplinary authority
- The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)

Texas Licensing and Disciplinary Authority

Mental health professionals in Texas are regulated by state licensing boards. Clients may file a complaint with the appropriate board if they believe the therapist has violated professional or ethical standards.

- Licensed Clinical Social Workers (LCSW)
